

Cable trays need to be sealed off



Overview

Cable trays and busways at floor level or at slab penetrations shall have a waterstop no less than 50 mm in height. Sealing shall be tight and reliable, without visible cracks or. Where cables pass through shafts, walls, slabs, or enter electrical panels or cabinets, openings shall be tightly sealed with firestopping materials in accordance with design requirements. Process flow: reserved openings → busway installation → distribution box positioning and installation →. cable trays are equivalent.
