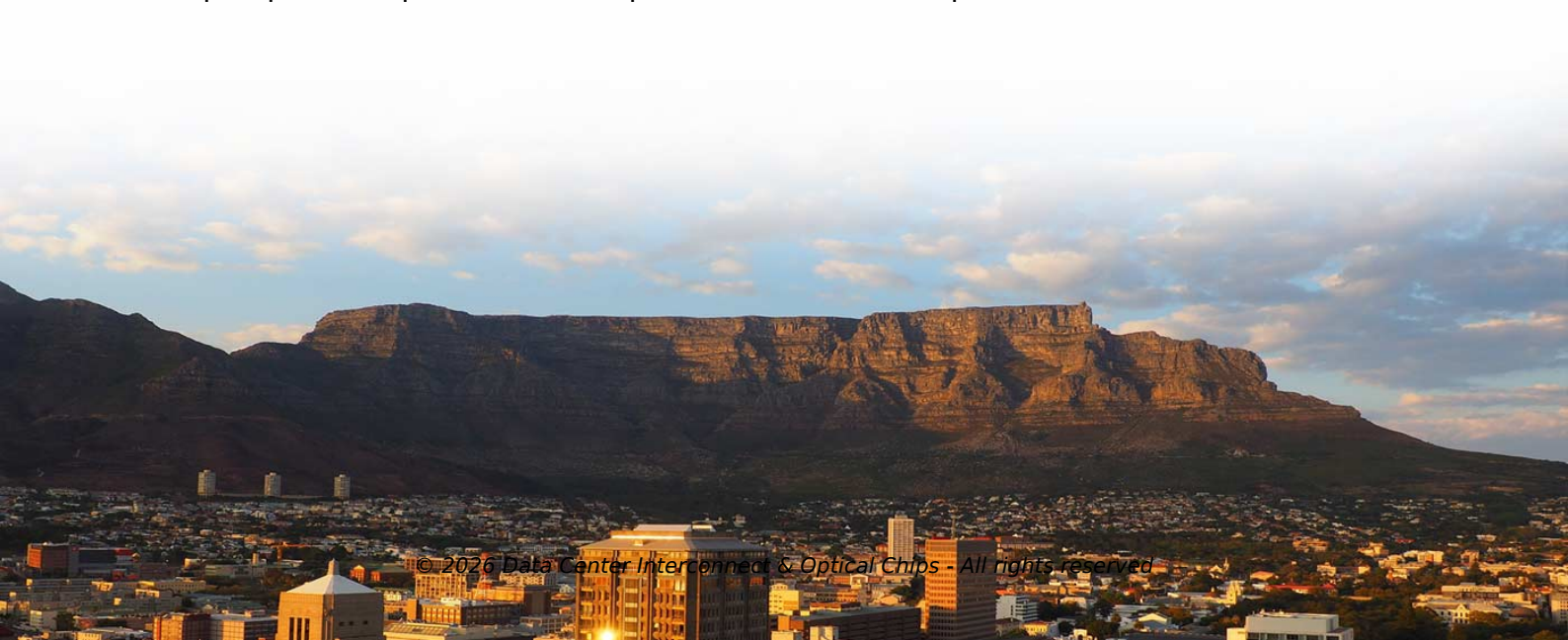


Can the pigtail be plugged in and out multiple times



Overview

The two downstream pigtail circuits will provide as much current as needed by your loads (like the light bulb, hair dryer, or TV) up to a combined 15 A. Some more math here, $\text{in} = \text{out}_1 + \text{out}_2$. So if it is 15 A, either pigtail can handle up to 15 A, one at a time but not. The single circuit into the pigtail will be able to handle a maximum of 15 A. Pigtails serve. We'll guide you through the fundamentals of creating secure links between multiple conductors and terminals. Professionals often prefer this method because it isolates issues. Assuming we're not talking about GFCI vs no GFCI, the question is to how we're splicing power through to the next outlet, through the outlet screws (second picture) or pigtailling (first picture). Pigtailling is the "better" method if time is not a factor, you can make a good splice, and you have. Some participants suggest that pigtails can be used for all three lines (hot, neutral, and ground) when wiring an outlet. There is a discussion about the appropriate wire.
