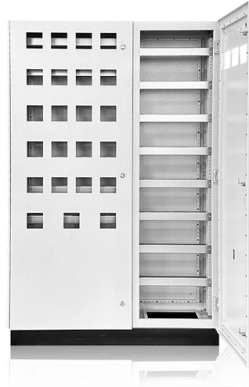


How to tighten the fiber optic cable rope



Overview

Swivel pulling eyes should be used to attach the pulling rope or tape to the cable to prevent cable twisting during the pull. There are many fiber optic cable installation tips, such as confirming the quality of a fiber optic cable before and after installation, avoiding fiber optic cable waste or exceeded pulling, etc. This post will illustrate why we need pulling grips in pulling fiber optic cables and how to install. External pulling grips (figure 2) are designed to lock into and tighten a fiber optic cable as a tensile load. Grip selection is based on cable diameter.
