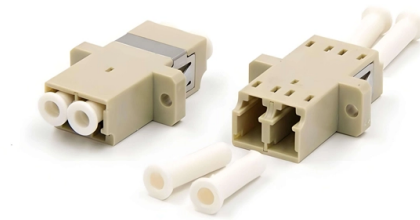


What cable tray should be used for fire emergency lines
