A Yellow jacket universally signifies Single-mode fiber (OS1 or OS2), which has a 9µm core and is designed for long-distance, high-speed transmission using laser light sources. However, with the introduction of metallic connectors like FC and ST—whose bodies are difficult to color-code—colored strain relief boots. Single-mode fiber (OS1 and OS2) always comes in a yellow jacket. OS1 is used for indoor, tight-buffered cabling, while OS2 is used outdoors or in loose-tube designs. The TIA-598-D standard defines a standardized color-coding system that engineers and technicians rely on to identify different types of fiber optic cables, connectors, and individual. Each fiber number has a color assigned to it: As for connectors: They are also color-coded for easy use and identification. In the early day, it was simple: orange, black or gray was used to identify multimode cables while yellow was used for single-mode ones.
